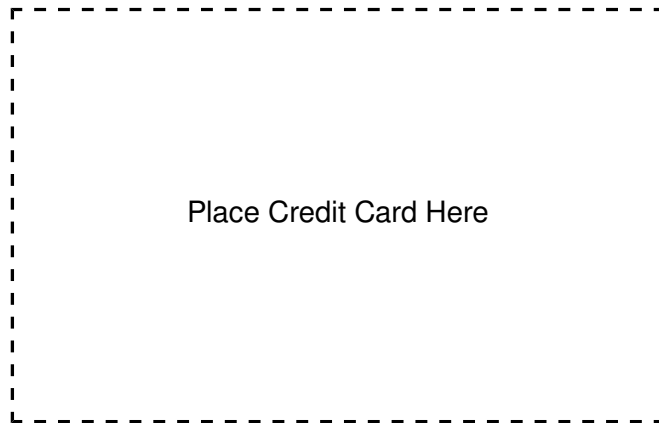
NECKLACE SIZING GUIDE

Whether you are finding the perfect fit for an everyday chain or our signature 18K Gold collection, accuracy is everything.

STEP 1: VERIFY YOUR PRINT SCALE

Before taking any measurements, ensure this page is printed correctly on A4 paper at exactly **100% scale**. Do not select "fit to page" or "scale to fit".

The Credit Card Test: Place a standard credit card inside the box below. If the card fits perfectly within the dashed lines, your scale is correct.



OPTION A: MEASURE AN EXISTING CHAIN

- 1. Select a necklace** that falls exactly where you want your new piece to sit.
- 2. Unclasp the chain** and lay it completely straight on a flat surface.
- 3. Measure** the length from end to end (including the clasp) using a standard tape measure or the printable ruler provided at the bottom of this page.

OPTION B: THE STRING METHOD

- 1. Cut a piece of string** or ribbon to your desired necklace length (e.g., 18 inches).
- 2. Wrap the string** around your neck, bringing the ends together in front.

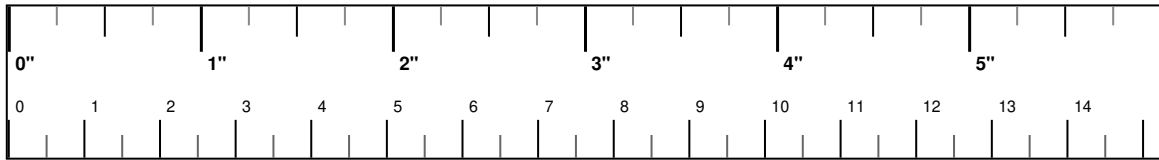
3. Observe the drop. This will show you exactly where the pendant or chain will rest on your chest. Adjust the string until you find the perfect placement, mark it, and measure the length.

STANDARD US LENGTHS & CONVERSIONS

US LENGTH (INCHES)	CENTIMETERS (CM)	STANDARD PLACEMENT / STYLE
14"	35.5 cm	Choker: Wraps closely around the base of the neck.
16"	40.6 cm	Collar: Sits perfectly at the base of the neck / collarbone.
18"	45.7 cm	Princess: Falls elegantly just below the collarbone. <i>(Most Popular)</i>
20"	50.8 cm	Matinee: Sits a few inches below the collarbone, ideal for plunging necklines.
22"	55.9 cm	Medium: Falls beautifully at or slightly above the bust.
24"	61.0 cm	Opera: Falls below any neckline, placing a pendant over the clothing.

PRINTABLE 6-INCH / 15-CM RULER

If you do not have a standard measuring tape at home, you may cut out the ruler below to measure your string or existing chain.



Note: To measure lengths greater than 6 inches, carefully mark the string at the 6-inch point, shift the ruler, and continue measuring.
